A time of Joy & Light

Today's readings may strike a chord with many people across our world today. Isaiah speaks of 'the poor, the broken-hearted, captivity and imprisonment'. With severe economic downturns and the consequences for job security, the grief of losing loved ones, multiple lockdowns and isolation; many will have been severely impacted during this *Annus Horribillis* of 2019. But, Isaiah also speaks of 'good news, binding up, liberty and freedom'. Through the presence of God; healing, restoration and better times lie ahead. Therein lies our hope and our joy.

Today, being the third Sunday of Advent (yes, it is here already - how is the Advent preparation going?) is also termed Gaudete Sunday, encouraging us to be joyful in anticipation of the birth of Jesus. As we start to hear, at last, some encouraging news regarding the Pandemic - a bit of light at the end of a long and dark tunnel, so through this season of expectancy and arrival, we have the joy of looking forward to the Messiah.

This prospect of the coming of Jesus, can, even in these difficult times, be a great source of joy. Pope Francis in his encyclical, *Evangelii Gaudium* (the Joy of the Gospel), similarly speaks of those antidotes to human suffering that Isaiah touches upon: 'those who accept [God's] offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew.'

Today, as we light the *Rose* candle symbolising that joy, there is a certain calming effect as we gaze upon the Advent wreath with its ever-increasing chinks of light. That light is what drew many people towards John the Baptist in his coming as a 'witness to speak for the light'. The witness that John gave was his sharp focus on his own hoped-for personal encounter with Jesus - this coming after he had already 'leapt for joy' in the womb of Elizabeth.

I was once told by a policeman that I fitted the description of somebody who had just committed a crime! (I hadn't) However, I haven't yet been mistaken for 'the light' as John was, but what a compliment that must have been to the deep witness of expectant joy that made up the whole of his life. Pope Francis also added, '[God] is always capable of restoring our joy, he makes it possible for us to lift up our heads and start anew.' Words of hope for what is about to happen.
