## Gospel Reflection for the Feast of the Holy Family

## **Happy Families**

In families where parenting skills are minimal, social workers tread a narrow path between keeping children safe and keeping families together.

Social workers know that most children living even in the very worst conditions would rather be with their parents than live in care. To the shocked onlooker, it's sometimes difficult to know why this should be.

Family attachments can't easily be over estimated and the importance of this attachment can hardly be over emphasised. It is in the context of our families that we first learn love.

Through praise and encouragement we learn our worth. Through example and guidance we learn the difference between right and wrong. It is in our family setting that we learn to feel confident and secure. It is from our parents that we learn our values.

The birth of Christ took place in circumstances of poverty, without many of the comforts we would consider basic, and yet we know that this was a family that shared every value that counts for anything.

It doesn't matter whether we are single parents, aunts, uncles, foster parents or grandparents ..... we look to the Holy Family and follow their example in making our own homes places of peace and happiness ..... places where true values flourish.
