#### A United Front

Today we hear again Jesus' final prayer before his betrayal and arrest. Knowing that he hasn't much time in this world left, Jesus prays for himself and for those he is to leave behind. The expectation is, that although he is to be taken from the world, His disciples will carry on his mission.

It's amazing isn't it, a small handful of disciples were charged with spreading Jesus' message in an age without television, mobile phones, the internet or Easy Jet .... yet you would be hard pushed to find anyone on today's planet who had not heard of Jesus. This is surely a tribute to the commitment and single mindedness of those early disciples. So now the baton of discipleship has been handed to us. Now it's our turn to further Jesus' mission. How does Jesus' prayer otherwise know as Jesus' 'Priestly Prayer' help us?

There is one line in Jesus prayer that strikes at who we are and what we stand for. "Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one." We are being asked to act as one. We are being asked to practice unity. So do we practice unity or are we a divided people? What attitude do we exhibit towards other believers in other denominations?
