Come, Holy Spirit!

If congregational singing was allowed this weekend, after the second reading we would be joining in an extra hymn called a 'sequence' with the Latin title *Veni Creator Spiritus*: it's an ancient hymn to the Holy Spirit. The first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, has given us the images the first disciples used to try to describe the presence of the Holy Spirit they received: the noise of a rushing wind, tongues of fire resting on each of them, and suddenly being able to speak foreign languages.

The sequence gives us many more images of the Holy Spirit, some of them very gentle and beautiful: the best of all consolers, the soul's most delightful guest, comfort in toil, coolness in heat, solace in the midst of woe. It describes some of the actions of the Holy Spirit, especially welcome as we gradually emerge from the trauma of the pandemic: healing our wounds, renewing our strength, pouring dew on our dryness, washing away the stains of guilt, bending the stubborn heart and will, melting the frozen, warming the chill, guiding the steps that go astray. And finally it prays that the Holy Spirit will give us comfort when we die, life with God on high and joys that never end.

Jesus promised that he would not leave us alone but would send the Holy Spirit to be with us, and that happens in many different ways. Over the next weeks and months, the Holy Spirit will be given to many children and adults who have been waiting patiently for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist and today we recall, in the Feast of Pentecost, the first coming of the Holy Spirit on the followers of Jesus after he was raised from death to life. In the Gospel for this feast, Jesus highlights one gift of the Spirit above all: twice he says to the disciples: Peace be with you. The first time he says he is giving them his own peace, a peace that the world cannot give. And the second time, he says that he is sending them out, as the Father sent him, to bring that peace to everyone, through forgiveness.

As we celebrate this feast, let's be open to receiving the gifts that the Holy Spirit offers us every day, especially the gift of peace through forgiveness.
