Going away...but still united in following the Lord

This weekend will be a strange weekend in both our parishes. There is a sense of change in the air. Fr Chris will be celebrating his final weekend Masses at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs before going on a well-earned sabbatical, while I will be saying my final weekend Masses at St Teresa's. It will also be, of course, for Fr Chris and I, the final week of living and working together. Or will it, in the case of the latter?

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus speaks to the twelve, "What about you, do you want to go away too?" I wonder how we might reply if parishioners ask us that same question over the weekend? Peter's response is a firm commitment to a continuation of following the Lord. In reality that is what we as priests are doing too. We are continuing to follow the Lord's call but in different ways.

I would hope that priests don't come with a 'Best Before Date' on them but there is a natural shelf life to a priest staying in one place for a certain length of time. In Fr Chris's case it is time for the 3 R's - Rest, Renewal and Reflection - after thirteen years at the helm of Tessie's and two at OLQOM. For me, the journey perhaps, begins to go slightly more uphill as I become a parish priest for the first time. In both cases, we look to the Lord as Peter did for what we need.

I would like to use this space to place on record my sincere thanks to Fr Chris for his personal warmth, kindness and encouragement over these last two years. I can also say that I now know the difference between an average red wine and a good red wine; that any salad should have at least 5 ingredients; and I know a lot more about cars than I ever did before! I would also like to thank wholeheartedly the parishioners of St Teresa's for their love, kindness and unfailing support over the same length of time.

It is funny how the readings can fall more often than not. St Paul today talks of 'leaving, joining and becoming one body'. Even though Fr Chris and I are going our separate ways, we will still be united in the wider universal church....Going away, but still following the Lord.
